

**Gonzales County Underground Water Conservation District  
Manager's Report  
August 2016**

On August 4<sup>th</sup> I traveled to San Antonio for the Region L Planning Group meeting. A copy of the meeting agenda is attached.

On August 10<sup>th</sup> I traveled to Lockhart to post the District's Tax Rate Hearing Notice.

On August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>, and 25<sup>th</sup> I traveled to San Marcos for the Texas Alliance of Groundwater Districts (TAGD) Groundwater Summit. A copy of the Summit Agenda is attached.

On August 26<sup>th</sup> I traveled to the Leesville area to check on a well reported to have an oily substance in the discharge water. Upon inspection of the discharge water I noted a slight sheen floating on top which I suspect to be an iron bacteria problem. I provided the well owner (Mr. Tristan) with instructions on chlorinating the well and asked him to get back with me in a few days on the results of this well treatment option.

During the month of August I registered 192 water wells from the TCEQ's water well report viewer which contains a list of historical wells dating back to the 1960's. The well reports locate the wells within a grid coordinate system but contain no gis coordinates so the well locations are located by the owners name and cross-checked with the Gonzales Appraisal District's Real Estate Rolls. Letters, with a copy of the well reports, are then mailed out to the current landowners to identify the exact location of the well on the property.

SSLGC's July production was about 884 ac-ft which is about 55% of the monthly allowable production.

CRWA's July production was about 248 ac-ft which is about 40% of the monthly allowable production.

SAWS July production was about 655 ac-ft which is about 67% of the monthly allowable production.

AQUA's June production was about 36 ac-ft which is about 9% of the monthly allowable production.

The Palmer Drought Index, as of August 30, 2016 indicates that we are not under any drought conditions.

On August 16<sup>th</sup>, I worked in the office contacting well owners and updating district records on old wells. I met with Mr. Sam Miller on Highway 80 and located his well and obtained data on well E236.

On August 17<sup>th</sup>, I met with Mr. Michael Tuch to locate four wells on his property on CR228.
