

**Gonzales County Underground Water Conservation District  
Manager's Report  
September 2016**

On September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>, and 29<sup>th</sup> I measured water levels in the District's Wilcox, Carrizo, Queen City, Sparta, and Yegua-Jackson Aquifers.

On September 9<sup>th</sup> I attended the Texas Water Development Board Brackish Water Stakeholder meeting in Austin. A copy of the meeting notice and PowerPoint presentation for the Carrizo-Wilcox Aquifer is attached.

On September 12<sup>th</sup> I met with a representative of Friedel Drilling Services at each of the five well sites scheduled for plugging and abandonment. We are waiting on landowners to sign plugging and abandonment agreements and remit payments before we begin the plugging activities.

On September 14<sup>th</sup> I met with representatives of the Hays Caldwell Public Utility Agency, Texas Water Alliance, Guadalupe Blanco River Authority, San Antonio Water Systems, Schertz-Seguin Local Government Corporation, and Canyon Regional Water Authority to discuss possible locations for Carrizo Aquifer outcrop monitor wells, costs associated with installation of those wells, and consultant contracts.

On September 14<sup>th</sup> I delivered Plugging and Abandonment Agreements to landowners in the Smiley area.

On September 27<sup>th</sup> I attended a meeting at the Guadalupe Blanco River Authority office in Seguin to discuss their Mid-Basin Project at the request of Representative Cyrie

SSLGC's August production was about ac-ft which is about % of the monthly allowable production.

CRWA's August production was about 234 ac-ft which is about 38% of the monthly allowable production.

SAWS August production was about ac-ft which is about % of the monthly allowable production.

AQUA's July production was about 41 ac-ft which is about 10% of the monthly allowable production.

The Palmer Drought Index, as of September 27, 2016 indicates that we are not under any drought conditions.
