

**Gonzales County Underground Water Conservation District
Manager's Report
December 2016**

On December 1st I met with representatives from the City of Gonzales and the City of Nixon to discuss water availability for economic development as required by the District's Management Plan.

On December 2nd I met with representatives of the Hays Caldwell Public Utility Agency, Texas Water Alliance, Guadalupe Blanco River Authority, San Antonio Water Systems, Schertz-Seguin Local Government Corporation, and Canyon Regional Water Authority to discuss possible locations for Carrizo Aquifer outcrop monitor wells, costs associated with installation of those wells, consultant contracts, and landowner agreements for the monitoring well locations.

On December 2nd I met with a representative from the Railroad Commission of Texas to discuss oil related activities that could endanger our aquifers, abandoned or deteriorated oil wells, and orphaned wells as required by the District's Management Plan.

On December 7th and 8th I attended the Texas Alliance of Groundwater Districts (TAGD) Executive Committee Meeting in Burnet. The purpose of the meeting was to review TAGD's value, operations, and long term strategies. A copy of the meeting debrief is attached.

On December 12th I met with representatives from the City of Smiley to discuss water availability for economic development as required by the District's Management Plan.

On December 16th drove through the Century Oaks Estates and Noahs land Estates subdivisions to locate existing water wells for registration. I located six existing water wells that have not been registered with the District.

On December 29th I travelled to the Nixon – Westhoff area to locate new wells that could be included in our existing water level and water quality monitoring system.

SSLGC's November production was about 584 ac-ft which is about 36% of the monthly allowable production.

CRWA's November production was about 211 ac-ft which is about 34% of the monthly allowable production.

SAWS November production was about 993 ac-ft which is about 102% of the monthly allowable production.

AQUA's October production was about 19 ac-ft which is about 5% of the monthly allowable production.

The Palmer Drought Index, as of December 27, 2016 indicates that we are currently not under any drought conditions.
