

**Gonzales County Underground Water Conservation District
Manager's Report
January 2018**

On January 2nd, 4th, 5th, 10th, 12th, 15th, 18th, 23rd, and 24th I measured water levels in the District's Wilcox, Carrizo, Queen City, Sparta, and Yegua-Jackson Aquifers.

On January 3rd I met with Gary Gaither of Lone Star Drilling, Leon Davis of Leon Davis Water Well & Pump Service and his attorney, and Michael Peck attorney for The Geffert Trust to discuss each party's status on enforcement action brought by the District.

On January 5th I collected water level and water quality data from two water wells drilled and completed by Maresh Drilling Company, Incorporated. This information was collected as part of the on-going enforcement action investigation.

On January 8th I held a conference call with representatives of Andrews & Foster, the Guadalupe County Groundwater District, and Daniel B. Stephens to setup the schedule for the Carrizo Aquifer Monitor Well Project. Drilling of the first monitor well will begin on February 5th at the Blumberg site.

On January 22nd I collected water level and water quality data from two water wells drilled and completed by Lone Star Drilling. This information was collected as part of the on-going enforcement action investigation.

On January 30th and 31st I attended the Texas Alliance of Groundwater Districts meeting in Austin. A copy of the meeting agenda is attached.

SSLGC's January production was about 846 ac-ft which is about 52% of the monthly allowable production.

CRWA's January production was about 233 ac-ft which is about 38% of the monthly allowable production.

SAWS January production was about 829 ac-ft which is about 85% of the monthly allowable production.

AQUA's December production was about 27 ac-ft which is about 7% of the monthly allowable production.

The Palmer Drought Index, as of January 23, 2018 indicates that the District is under abnormally dry conditions.
