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

ARWA's March production was 274.17 ac-ft which is about 28.31% of the monthly allowable production.

CRWA's March production was about 677.39 ac-ft which is about 97.69% of the monthly allowable production.

GBRA's March production was 91.89 ac-ft which is 7.35% of the monthly allowable production.

SAWS March production was about 1,074.36 ac-ft which is about 110.30% of the monthly allowable production.

SSLGC's March production was 1,198.56 about ac-ft which is about 74.31% of the monthly allowable production.


