

Gonzales County Underground Water Conservation District Manager's Report March 2024

On March 4th, I met with Mr. Mike St. John, District Board Member to discuss District Rules.

On March 8th I met with Mr. St. John, and Mr. Barry Miller, District Board Member Secretary Treasurer for a Rules Committee meeting.

On March 22nd I submitted to the State Office of Administrative Hearings my prefiled testimony on the ongoing contested case. Throughout the month of March, I corresponded with attorney and expert witnesses.

On March 29th I attended the Texas Water Foundation, Texas Water Leaders Alumni networking event. Dr. Timothy Bonner Professor and Director Aquatic Biology B.S. Program Meadows Foundation, Kelley Cochran, General Manager GCGCD, and Ms. Virginia Parker, Executive Director San Marcos River Foundation provided discussions on the future of water planning in the state of Texas.

Throughout the month of March water quality samples were taken and sent to the laboratory at A&M and the certified laboratory in Seguin.

AQUA's February production was about 44 ac-ft which is about 10% of the monthly allowable production.

CRWA's March production was about 581 ac-ft which is about 94% of the monthly allowable production.

GBRA's March production was 4 ac-ft which is 0.3% of the monthly allowable production.

SAWS March production was about 848 ac-ft which is about 87% of the monthly allowable production.

SSLGC's March production was about 1,000 ac-ft which is about 62% of the monthly allowable production.

The Palmer Drought Index, as of March 26, 2024, indicates that the District is currently under no drought conditions. The latest drought map shows a few small areas of increased drought in Texas in the week of March 26, 2024. Overall, the drought increased by 1% points in the state.



Gudalupe-Blanco River Authority Meter Reading - Usage 2024



 - (b) THE GROUNDWATER OWNERSHIP AND RIGHTS described by this section.
- (c) Nothing in this code shall be construed as granting the authority to deprive or divest a landowner, including a landowner's lessees, heirs, or assigns, of the groundwater ownership and rights described by this section or affect the existence of COMMON LAW DEFENSES or other defenses to liability under the rule of capture.
